

2021 CSC's Educational Campaign Report

1) **2021 Southern Denver regional multi-media advertising campaign** was partially funded (\$5K) by Colorado Stormwater Council (CSC), focusing at Fountain Creek Watershed (Monument to Pueblo), but reaching Denver and Douglas County by radio as well, in addition to online radio and TV at State-wide level. The campaign was also supported by CSC member's social media efforts enhancing state-wide level reach. The total cost of the educational campaign in 2021 was \$23,500. This established campaign has been implemented since 2013. CSC's financial support during 2019-2020-2021 allowed to maintain a broad reach with Bus, Radio, TV. Had CSC not supported the program, only 1 to 2 platforms may have been chosen and would have had a much smaller reach. Hence the need for collaboration to reach a state level. Total Impressions in 2021: **9.3 Million**. Target Audience: Home Owners, DIY, Millennials. The campaign run from June to August 2021 (12 Weeks).

2) CSC created and/or adapted eight (8) 30-seconds **Public Service Announcements (PSA)** in 2018 for \$3,600. The videos were published in YouTube. There were **500 views in 2019, 1000 views in 2020, 1250 views in 2021** for all 8 PSA's. CSC's created a Facebook and LinkedIn Account since 2020 and promoted the following 3 PSAs:

3) 2021 Northern Denver radio campaign was partially funded (\$5K) by CSC since 2020, focusing on Greeley, but covering all northern Colorado, from Ft Collins, to Jefferson and Arapahoe County. The total cost of the radio campaign in 2021 was \$16,220, 15 spots per week. The campaign run from June to December 2021. Total number of listeners reached: **3,7 Million**

4) Virtual Bike Tour at Denver, partially funded (\$1K) by CSC. The total cost was \$8K. Urban Water Cycle Tour Route: 6-mile route along South Platte from Thornton to Globeville Landing. Bike Tours have been held annually since 2010, CSC became a sponsor since 2017.

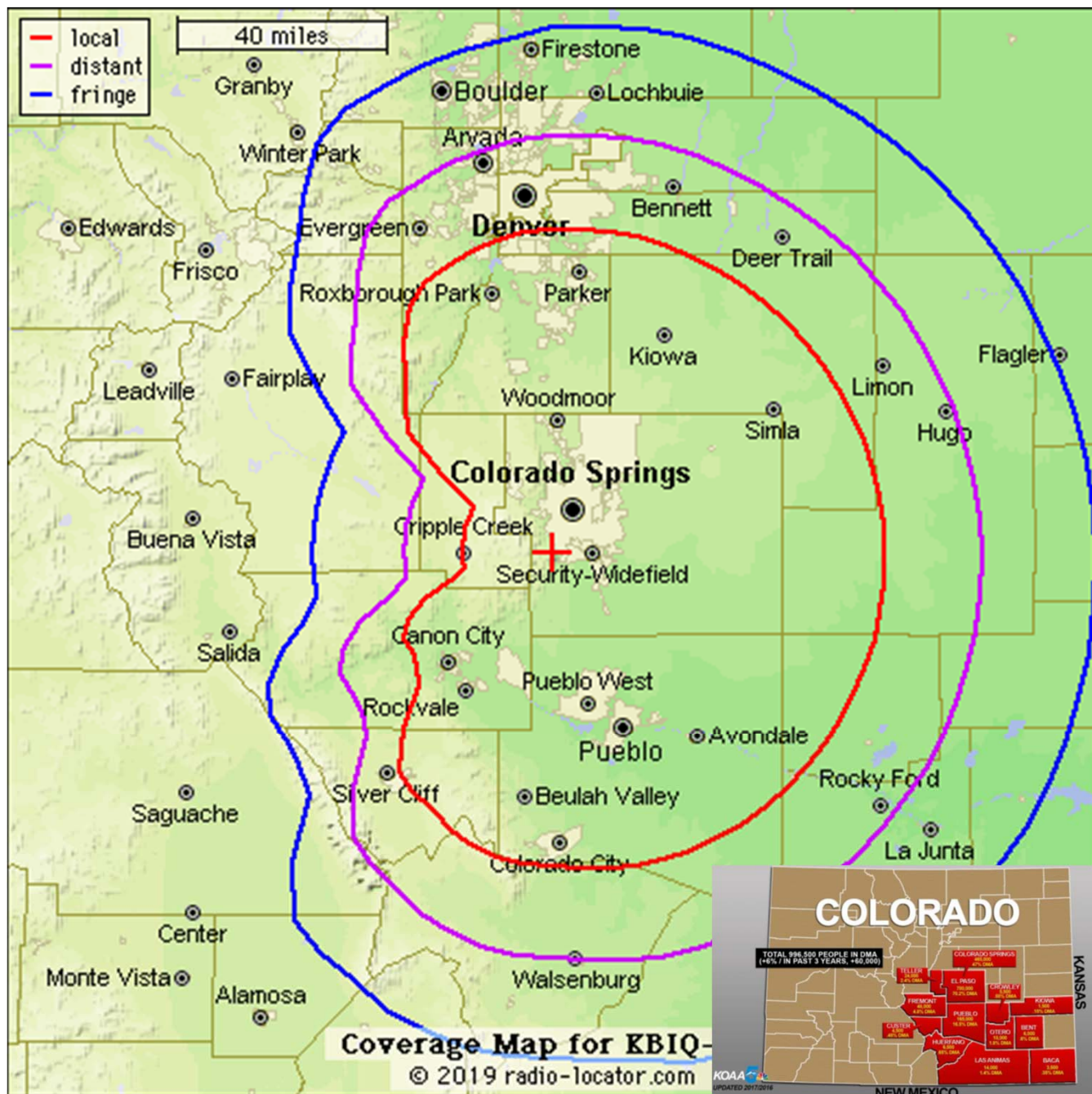

Join us on either June 11 or 12 for a fun, free waterway bike tour along Cottonwood Creek in Colorado Springs. This tour will connect community members to local water and recreation resources through an approximately 9-mile (mostly downhill) ride.

Both tour days start at Frank Costello Park, with a short uphill ride to Cowpoke Flood Detention and Development. You will then ride downhill all the way to a creek restoration site on Monument Creek, stopping at several points of interest along the way to hear from local experts. With a short ride back uphill, you will end at Crit Cafe for our final speakers, networking and refreshments on your own. After the tour, you can choose to ride 9 miles uphill back to the start, or arrange your own carpool. Tour topics include:

- What are the Cottonwood Creek, Fountain Creek, and Arkansas River watersheds?
- Why is water quality important? What is stormwater?
- How is Colorado Springs conserving water and planning for future water supply?
- How are community partners connecting neighborhoods to trails and creeks?
- How can maintaining pipes allow us to restore creeks?
- How do we ensure waterways are healthy? How can you protect stream health?
